They occurred in almost every town in Hiratsuka City. In particular, 3 cases occurred in Tamura and 2 cases each in Takara Cho, Yamashita, Sakuragaoka and Mitsukecho. There have been cases of bicycles being stolen while parked on the premises of residences. Also, there have been cases of bicycles being stolen even if they were locked. When you park your bicycle, we recommend that you use a wire-type lock that is sold at home centers, and so on. There were 15 cases of motorcycle thefts in Hiratsuka City. 5 cases in Megumigaoka, 2 cases in Shinomiya, Mitsuke Cho and Beniya Cho. When you park your motorcycle, we recommend that you use an anti-theft lock in addition to the normal lock.
